The Boys Basketball team made it to the second round of playoffs. The Boys Hockey team earned the Conference Championship title and also made it to the second round of the playoffs. Logan Peterson advanced to the State Wrestling Meet.

Now, spring sports are getting ready to start. We are looking forward to the great seasons that lie ahead.

Student Council is gearing up for their next service project: Books for Africa. This organization collects, ships, and distributes gently used books for students of all ages in Africa, with the goal of ending the book famine on that continent. All the schools in the district will be participating in this project! We will have donation boxes at all three schools from March 28th through April 8th. Directors' and Principals' Report to the Somerset Board of Education March, 2016

Professional Learning

- Sessions were held this month to support our initial and professional licensed teachers in the Professional Development Plan (PDP) process. Teachers, administrators, and pupil service professionals who completed an educator preparation program on or after September 1, 2004, renew under the PI 34 rules and renew their licenses by completing a verified Professional Development Plan (PDP) although all personnel have the option to renew their licensure through this method.
- An overview session covered the process, timeline, and necessary elements. Two working sessions were also held to provide supported time to craft PDP goals and action plans.

Educator Effectiveness (EE)

The next session for EE support occurred on March 17. The focus for this support seminar was developed using input from our summary year teachers. Time was spent reviewing the details of the documentation log along with three questions educators may use for reflection that will provide evidence for their artifacts. Educators were also able to review the parts of the Summative Report to better understand how all of the observations and artifacts will come together at the end of this cycle.

Assessment

- ACCESS testing for our EL (English Learner) students is now complete. We should get the results of this assessment before the end of this school year.
- The Statewide administration of the ACT and ACT Workkeys for our juniors took place the first week of March. Much work was done at the building level and led by a committee to ensure a positive testing environment for our juniors as well as meaningful learning experiences for our 9th, 10th, and 12th grade students. Our juniors participated in activities the week before testing to help them prepare mentally and emotionally for the test. Parents, teachers, and administrators served breakfast to the juniors the morning of the ACT. Freshmen and sophomores participated in college visits while our seniors packaged meals at Feed my Starving Children. The commitment and planning by the high school staff helped make this a successful day that went off without a hitch.
- Planning is underway for the WI Forward Exam, DLM and ACT Aspire. Schedules are being built as all of these assessments are online, student data is being uploaded, and proctors are being trained. All of this work requires great collaboration, communication, and commitment.

Other News from our Schools

District News

- On February 25 and 26, Shannon Donnelly, Chris Kamrath, and Officer Adam Malean attended an ALICE training at Arcadia High School. ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) training prepares individuals to handle the threat of an Active Shooter. ALICE teaches individuals to participate in their own survival, while leading others to safety. Shannon will be sharing information from this training with staff at upcoming staff meetings and will begin making changes to the district Emergency Management Plan based on the new best practice recommendations highlighted by the ALICE training.
- The Fine Arts Festival occurred on February 25 and was once again an amazing display of art and music. The art and music departments did a great job of transforming the middle school and preparing our students to perform and display their artistic talents!

Elementary School

• On March 14th the elementary school began a three week read-a-thon. In addition to raising funds for a variety of causes (parent group, learn to love, PBIS) the event also promotes reading in the school. The event will conclude with an assembly on April 8th. All students who met a reading goal

DRAFT REGULAR MEETING - BOARD OF EDUCATION SCHOOL DISTRICT OF SOMERSET February 15, 2016

Board Vice President Marie Colbeth called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Roll Call was taken. Present were board members Marie Colbeth, Tammie Wishard, Mike Connor, Patty Schachtner and Nancy Dressel. Absent was Bob Gunther and Brian Moulton.

Connor moved, with second by Wishard, to approve the agenda, with two changes: the Balanced Report Card discussion was moved to take place right after Discussion and Action item A under Business Services Committee was moved to the occur right after groups or individuals wishing to be heard. Motion carried unanimously.

RMM Solutions: Daniel Johnson and Randy Lee from RMM Solutions presented the IT report. RMM completed a full comprehensive network assessment on February 3, 2016. RMM found no compelling reason to change the current mobility strategy. Moving forward RMM will be aware of reducing the cost and complexity of the current network infrastructure while maintaining a high level of availability. Dressel asked if there were any 'a ha' moments, RMM stressed the key will be to reduce complexity while keeping the infrastructure working. RMM also provided an update on E-rate, part of updating the technology plan is mapping out a plan to simplify the network even more. RMM is working with Superintendent Rosburg on the development of the E-rate plan. Somerset IT and RMM are working on the enhancement of the current wireless network to ensure high availability for the October 14, 2016 Middle Border Conference meeting.

Student Council Report: Student Council Representative Mackenzie Erickson provided the student council report. Polar Daze has recently wrapped up and was a very successful and fun weeklong series of events for the students to participate in. The winter sports teams are doing well along with Danceline and Robotics. The junior class is preparing for the March 1st ACT test. The students had an opportunity to attend a three weekend long ACT prep class. On the day of the ACT the seniors will be doing service work and Feed my Starving Children and the sophomores will be doing college visits.

Directors' and Principals' Report: Director of Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment, Trish Sheridan, spoke of the upcoming assessments. February 5 was a PLC day that focused on technology. It was the first EdTech day and was a huge success. Initial training for the WI Forward Exam is being rolled out across the state and details are being finalized for the ACT plus Writing assessment to be conducted on March 1. Discussion:

Teaching and Learning Committee: Committee Chair Wishard spoke of Standards Based Grading Report and the 2016-17 calendar. Also discussed was the alternative phy-ed credit. The PE Health PLC wanted to speak to the committee about their concerns. After reviewing their concerns, the committee supported that no changes be made to the policy at this time. This was discussion only. Standards Based Grading Report was also discussed and the principals shared at the committee meeting how Infinite Campus is working with Standards Based Grading. This topic will be coming back to the March committee meeting for further discussion. The teacher input on phy-ed topic was welcomed by the board.

Business Services Committee: Committee Chair Colbeth shared that the board members had received the debt schedule that Gerberding provided. There were no questions on the topic.

Balanced Scorecard Report: Trish Sheridan, Director of Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment provided a report on the Balanced Scorecard. Sheridan shared the building goals and how they were gathered and how Somerset faired against the state level benchmark. The report that was shared is the tool that was used to look at specific data right down to the classroom level. What can Somerset do to impact learning in a positive way was one of the questions that was looked at and discussed. Student learning and student development were broken out and discussed. Each building's data was walked through by the building principals. Elementary school data was used to build SLO and growing PALS development was discussed at the elementary school level. The middle school looked for achievement in the Badger scores and the Performance Series. Their successes and items yet to be achieved were discussed. The high school walked through insight statements and ACT test data. The high school has focused on reading and how to encourage reading throughout the school. The AP and Honors courses were discussed as well as the jump in the number of students taking these classes. It was stressed by the principals that growth is occurring and the teachers are working hard on connecting the topics to the students.

Schachtner shared that she appreciates the data and it may be productive to schedule a special session in the future to walk through it even further and get any questions answered. Sheridan added that the timing of the embargoed data did not make it conducive to work collaboratively on this. The mid-year SLO check ins were explained and how comparing the data happens. Rosburg shared that he meets with the principal's weekly/monthly to track the growth and if there needs to be improvements, the building level conversations are happening to ensure growth. Schachtner would like to know what we can do to inspire students to take AP classes, we want them to not be afraid to get a C in the advanced classes. More emphasis should be placed on the learning and not so much on the grade, it is ok to try the tougher classes. Colbeth asked how to encourage students to take AP, Honors or Dual Credit. Moore shared that the counselors are a great resource and it depends on the path of the student.

Dressel asked about the students taking AP courses. She asked if this is the total number of enrolled students in the courses. Moore explained the number and Sheridan also spoke of the dedication and hard work the students put in.

The practice lockdown drill was touched upon. Shannon Donnelly will be attending ALICE training. Wishard asked if state mandates how many lockdown drills a school needs to do throughout the year. Rosburg responded that no, the state does not mandate but the school districts are planning and practicing more of them.

Information: Superintendent Rosburg stated student enrollment is 1,594 which is up two from last month. An Open Enrollment report was provided to the board as well as a staffing report. The next committee meetings are tentatively planned for either March 7 or March 14. The preference of the board is to have the meetings on March 14 as March 7 is during spring break and staff may not be available to attend. The consensus of the board is for the next committee meetings to be held March 14. Rosburg explained the Smile 4 Life program. It is a non-profit organization that receives funding from Federal programs for students that do not otherwise have access to dental care. The program is currently used as neighboring districts and all spoke very highly of the program. Somerset will be partnering with Smile 4 Life and parents will have the opportunity to use this opportunity. Mental health is a topic that the Middle Border Conference superintendents have discussed. Rosburg reached out to Family Means and asked if they could provide services to students and staff on a weekly basis. Rosburg spoke of the community engagement calendar and the availability of the board to attend meetings.

Board Report: CESA 11 Update: Colbeth spoke of the mental health summit that CESA is putting together and that CESA is working on putting together their board evaluations. Colbeth also shared a document put together by CESA that highlights what other districts have achieved. Community and School Involvement: Schachtner spoke of a class for parents on April 16 that is for parents to learn about adolescents. There is a trauma informed care class on April 14, Schachtner will share the information to those that want to attend. Forensics is doing well, the play is upcoming and there are Somerset students that have art displayed at WITC. WASB Convention Report & Recap: Rosburg spoke of the convention and provided a brief recap. Sara Eichten was recognized at the convention as the Principal of the

Year. Rosburg also spoke of creating a legacy and what it is to be a board member and how Somerset could facilitate something like this. Board member Brian Moulton is researching this and more will be shared on this topic.

Dressel moved, with second by Schachtner to take a 15 minute recess and reconvene at 9:20. Motion Passed Unanimously.

Upon roll call vote, all voted yes to move to Closed Session. Discussion ensued on topic.

Dressel moved with second by Schachtner to move out of Closed Session. Upon roll call vote, all voted yes to move out of Closed Session with no announcement coming out of Closed Session.



Employee Assistance Program Fee for Service Contract

This Agreement entered into by and between FamilyMeans, whose address is 1875 Northwestern Avenue South, Stillwater, Minnesota, 55082 and Somerset School District whose address is 625 Sunrise Drive, P. O. Box 100, Somerset, Wisconsin, 54025.

The contact person for FamilyMeans is Diane Cragoe, MS, LMFT, Employee Assistance Program Coordinator and the contact person for Somerset School District is Randy Rosburg, District Administrator.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Agreement shall be to establish and maintain an employee assistance program for the employees of Somerset School District. Said services shall be made available for mental health assessment and treatment for individuals, couples and families, financial counseling, concerns surrounding the elderly and referral for drug and alcohol abuse or addiction. The provision of services shall be for the purpose of, and hence, designed to provide assistance to the employees of Somerset School District and their immediate family members.

INDEMNIFICATION

Somerset School District agrees to indemnify and hold FamilyMeans harmless for any liabilities, claims, judgments, damages or costs, including reasonable attorneys' fees, asserted or awarded against or incurred by FamilyMeans, its directors, officers or employees as a result of any act of omission of Somerset School District. FamilyMeans shall notify Somerset School District of any written claims or demands made against FamilyMeans for which Somerset School District is liable under this section.

FamilyMeans agrees to indemnify and hold Somerset School District harmless for any liabilities, claims, judgments, damages or costs, including reasonable attorneys' fees, asserted or awarded against or incurred by Somerset School District, its directors, officers, or employees as a result of any act or omission of FamilyMeans. Somerset School District

shall notify FamilyMeans of any written claims or demands made against Somerset School District for which FamilyMeans might be liable under this section.

TIME PERIOD

This Agreement is for the period of one year beginning March 15, 2016, ending March 14, 2017; however, either party may terminate this Agreement with 30 days advanced written notice to the other party.

SERVICES TO BE RENDERED

In exchange for the fee described below, FamilyMeans agrees to provide services by and on behalf of Somerset School District to employees referred to its attention for assistance sessions.

BASIC SERVICES

FamilyMeans agrees to provide the following services/materials:

- Management Training: One, 60 minute session on mutually agreed upon topic.
- Employee Training: Up to two, 30 minute sessions on mutually agreed upon topic.
- Telephone or in-person consultation with Administrators/Managers/Supervisors to assist them in utilizing the EAP regarding employee problems.
- Annual renewal letter mailed by the Somerset School District explaining the benefits of the EAP to employees/family members.
- Promotional materials, i.e., brochures, information cards.
- Utilization reports provided quarterly or as deemed appropriate based on utilization of services.
- Satisfaction reports provided annually.
- One EAP newsletter for each employee to be distributed on a quarterly basis.
- Annual site visit.
- Courtesy referrals for one free, legal consultation per employee per year. Referrals for confidential legal consultations are provided to established local law firms in Stillwater, Minnesota and River Falls, Wisconsin based on the employee's state of residence. Legal consultations are not provided in matters wherein interests of the employee and employer are adverse or may be adverse. Any fees for legal services or consulting after the initial consultation are subject to agreement between the employee and the legal provider.

Counseling services addressing employees' personal and work-related problems.

The employer agrees to:

- Notify the Employee Assistance Program Manager of any complaints on services being offered, and cooperate in the investigation and resolution of these complaints.
- Disburse newsletters and other promotional materials on the program.
- Provide information on the company's health insurance plan so appropriate referrals can be made.
- Schedule training sessions on an as needed basis.

FEES

Somerset School District agrees to pay FamilyMeans an administrative fee of \$263.75 per quarter to equal the sum of \$1,055.00 annually. Somerset School District also agrees to pay \$80.00 for each session for each employee in any given year, with a maximum of two (2) sessions per problem episode meeting insurance coverage criteria or three (3) sessions per problem not eligible for insurance coverage. Sessions are for assessment and referral of Somerset School District employees, board members and their family members. Based on a utilization rate of 3% and 204 employees plus 7 board members, you may estimate the expected cost of the contract at \$2,575.00. Fee for assessments and/or any optional services purchased will be billed by FamilyMeans and paid for by Somerset School District at the end of every quarter throughout the contract year.

Employees will be informed when making their initial intake appointment that failing to attend an appointment without prior cancellation will result in the subtraction of one EAP session. Somerset School District will be charged the per-session fee for the failed appointment. To insure confidentiality, FamilyMeans will keep track of sessions available to individual employees.

MODIFICATION OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement may only be modified in writing by mutual consent of the parties. If unusual circumstances require a high rate of usage, Somerset School District and FamilyMeans will renegotiate the terms of this contract. Any modification of this Agreement must be signed by both parties in the same manner as the original Agreement.

INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR STATUS

For all intents and purposes under this Agreement, FamilyMeans shall act as an independent contractor and neither means, mode nor method of performance hereunder shall be subject to control of Somerset School District. FamilyMeans acknowledges that it provides the same or similar services at large to third parties. FamilyMeans, its employees, agents and officers shall have no right or expectation to any compensation, salaries, wages, fringe benefits or other remuneration for the services provided hereunder except as described under the paragraph entitled Fees. FamilyMeans shall be responsible to provide its own office space, equipment, materials and supplies so as to fulfill its responsibilities to Somerset School District under this Agreement and, additionally, it shall carry such unemployment compensation and workers' compensation coverage as may be required of it under law.

AVAILABILITY BASIS AGREEMENT

It is the understanding of FamilyMeans that it shall make available its services under this Agreement to and on behalf of Somerset School District; however, Somerset School District shall not be compelled to make any minimal number of referrals on an annual basis during the term of this Agreement, nor shall it be responsible to pay to FamilyMeans any retainer or minimal fee in exchange for FamilyMeans making its services available on an as needed basis under the terms of this Agreement.

5609 - PRE-EXPULSION

Pre-Expulsion is to be utilized only in cases where administration deems that it is in the best interest of the student to have an opportunity to return to school after a period of alternative educational opportunities or stay in school. Pre-expulsion will only be utilized in first-time offense cases.

Pre-Expulsion Process

- A. Student infraction occurs.
- B. Building Administration contacts the District Administrator to determine if a pre-expulsion conference is appropriate.
 - 1. If no pre-expulsion conference is to be held, the student may be suspended or be moved toward expulsion.
 - 2. If a pre-expulsion conference is to be held, the student may be suspended for up to fifteen (15) school days.
- C. Building administration informs parent/guardian of need for pre-expulsion conference within 5 days. A date and time is chosen.
- D. The District Administrator/designee will send a letter informing the student and parent/guardian, of the pre-expulsion conference.
 - Letter will include:
 - a. student name/address
 - b. parent/guardian names/address
 - c. description of the infraction
 - d. dates of suspension
 - e. date and time of pre-expulsion conference
 - f. date and time of expulsion hearing (if necessary)
 - g. names of administration present for conference
 - h. how the conference will be conducted
 - Certified letters are sent to the parents and student separately.
- E. At pre-expulsion conference, discuss the probability of going to expulsion, manifestation determination, and behavior agreement.
- F. Conference officer is the District Administrator/Designee.
- G. The conference shall be conducted as follows:
 - 1. A presentation by the principal and/or designee to outline evidence and charges in this case.
 - 2. An opportunity for the student and/or parent/guardian to present evidence on their behalf

- 3. The seeking of a stipulation to the facts of the charges.
- 4. The seeking of a willingness on the part of the student and/or parent/guardian to voluntarily accept an opportunity to avoid an expulsion hearing for this first-time offense.
- 5. An agreement by the student and parent/guardian to conditions for return to school and have the expulsion hearing placed in abeyance.
- H. Parties come to an understanding of determinations made at conference.
- I. The District Administrator/designee provides a summary of the conference via a letter to the following:
 - 1. student
 - 2. parent/guardian
 - 3. administrators involved
 - 4. student file
- J. A report will be provided to the Board of Education at their next regularly scheduled meeting
- K. The student and parent/ guardian must sign summary statement.
- L. The student and parent/guardian must sign "Conditions of Continuance" statement.
- M. The student's expulsion hearing is held in abeyance for one year if the student meets the conditions of continuance.
- N. The length of time for a pre-expulsion is limited to the remainder of the semester in which the offense occurred plus one additional quarter or term. Any recommendation for a pre-expulsion beyond the time-frame noted above requires action of the Board of Education.
