REGULAR MEETING - BOARD OF EDUCATION SCHOOL DISTRICT OF SOMERSET August 18, 2014

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President Brian Moulton Called the meeting to Order at 6:02 p.m.

Roll Call was taken. Present were Brian Moulton, Marie Colbeth, Mike Connor Bob Gunther, Tom Walters and Tammie Wishard. Kelly Ott was absent, arrived at 7:25.

Walters moved, with second by Connor, to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Moulton moved with second by Wishard to move to Closed Session in Accordance with State Statute 19.85 (1) (c) for the purpose of considering negotiations proposals for administrators and a supervisor support staff employee. Upon roll call vote, all voted Yes to move to closed session.

Gunther moved, with second by Wishard to approve the Memorandum of Agreement for Lane Johnson as presented. Upon roll call vote, all voted Yes. Motion passed unanimously.

Gunther moved, with second by Wishard to approve a wage increase for Rod Hawkins equal to \$49,000.00 for the 2014-2015 school year and a \$1,000.00 increase at completion of Business Official degree. Upon roll call vote, Gunther, Moulton, Connor and Wishard voted Yes. Colbeth and Walters voted No. Motion passed.

Gunther moved with second Walters to approve item #1, a 2% base wage increase given as an equal dollar amount for all principals and directors and table items 2-7 until next Board of Education Closed Session. The board will review a Principal and Director contract prior to the next meeting. Upon roll call vote, all voted Yes. Motion passed unanimously.

Walters moved, with second by Wishard to move out of Closed Session. Upon roll call vote, all voted Yes. Motion passed unanimously.

RMM Solutions, Amy Arnold: Amy Arnold presented on the working relationship, monthly reports and the IT work RMM Solutions will be doing on campus. Agents will be installed on Tuesday, August 19th, these agents will be able to remediate issues before the end user sees them. Also explained was the ticketing system and how the tickets will be submitted by the end user. The agents for submitting tickets will be installed on all staff computers. Also explained was the meeting schedule between RMM and the school district. The schedule for the RMM onsite engineer was discussed as well.

Groups or Individuals Wishing to Be Heard: Moulton read the rules for this portion of the meeting. No one came forward,

Positive Recognition: Susie Kadlec, Cory Lindenberg and Carolyn Spoerl; High School English Instructor's spoke on the topic of PLC and ACT Alignment. Mr. Lindenberg spoke on the reading portion of the ACT and what specific skills do students need to answer these questions well. Much work has been done in the PLCs to help students succeed on the ACT. The results are helpful to the teachers in that it helps them address topics and give students what they need to be successful. Ms. Kadlec explained the process and how students were able to see their successes. Ms. Kadlec explained the service learning projects and the hard work that the students put into the many projects. Ms. Spoerl shared that about half of the students had success and what was learned from those that did not achieve success. The feedback from students, staff and the community was positive on the projects.

Discussion

The variables the district is waiting on for the budget are still up in the air. The JK numbers are still increasing, the line of credit will be discussed in the Action portion of the meeting and Gerberding also shared that the auditors are on site this week.

Superintendent Information: Rosburg spoke of the enrollment numbers and the number is currently at 1,581. The next committee meetings will take place on Monday, September 8, 2014 prior to the Annual Meeting. The date and time for the Annual Meeting has been set for Monday, September 8, 2014 at 8:00 p.m. Superintendent Rosburg also provided updates on the parking lot project. He also invited the board to the new employee luncheon which is Wednesday, August 20. High School Principal Chris Moore shared the names of the student council representatives that will begin attending the board meetings in September.

Board Report:

Tom Walters provided a recap from the CESA dinner that he attended with Marie Colbeth Kelly Ott. He also shared that at the last CESA meeting they used ZOOM and it worked well.

Community and School Involvement: Nothing to report at this meeting.

Directors' and Principals' Reports: Gerberding explained that the check register format has changed and is still being tweaked so that it provides all needed information. Walters asked if Gerberding could provide figures as to what percentage of the budget has been used. Walters stated that CESA presents budget numbers this way and it is helpful. Gerberding explained that once the reports are set up this should be doable. Colbeth asked about the athletic expenditures to which Gerberding provided information. Director of Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment, Trish Sheridan spoke of all the training that staff has been taking part in over the summer. Amongst the activities was the presentation by Elizabeth Rossini as well as a trip to CESA and bringing in the PLC leaders.

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MINUTES OF THE 2014 BUDGET HEARING AND ANNUAL MEETING SCHOOL DISTRICT OF SOMERSET SEPTEMBER 8, 2014 LEARNING CENTER CONFERENCE ROOM

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Board members present: Robert Gunther, Mike Connor, Tom Walters, Marie Colbeth and Tammie Wishard. Absent: Brian Moulton and Kelly Ott. Community members present: School Superintendent Randy Rosburg, Chris Kamrath, Chris Moore, Sara Eichten, Trisha Sheridan, Dave Gerberding, Kathy Brake, Lorri Baillargeon, Jen Sutton, Becky Olson, Anton Lang and Rochelle Lindquist. Others present: Jordan Willi.

School Board Vice President Bob Gunther called the 2014 Budget Hearing to order at 8:00 p.m. Gunther briefly went over the guidelines of the meeting and read the welcome message. Business Manager David Gerberding reviewed the budget planning calendar along with the 2014-2015 budget process timeline. Gerberding indicated the upcoming year's budget timeline will likely be similar as in past years. An addition to the calendar will be long term budgetary discussions and what the projections look like. These will be held in the October-November and March-April timeframe.

Gerberding went on to review and explain portions of the 2014-15 budget, including highlights of the Special Projects Fund, Debt Services Fund, Food Service and Community Service Funds. Noting that the Food Service Fund will be running at a small surplus for 2014-2015. Gerberding also recapped the outstanding referendum approved indebtedness.

Gerberding explained the Tax Levy History and stated property values are projected to increase about 6.0%. The projected Mill Rate is \$11.08 per \$1,000.00 value. There were no other questions and the Budget Hearing was concluded.

Gunther called the 2014 Annual Meeting to order at 8:12 p.m., explaining the procedures for the meeting, and opened the floor to elect a meeting Chairperson. Superintendent Rosburg moved, with second by Lorri Baillargeon, to elect Bob Gunther as Chairperson of the 2014 Annual Meeting. Motion carried.

Rosburg moved, with second by Brakke, to elect Rochelle Lindquist as Teller of the 2014 Somerset School District Annual Meeting. Motion carried. Gunther stated last year's annual meeting minutes were provided in the meeting packet as informational since the minutes had been approved at the October, 2013 regular school board meeting.

Board Treasurer Mike Connor moved to [dispense with the reading of and] to approve the Treasurer's Report with a second by Tom Walters. Motion carried.

Rosburg reported on the Business portion of the meeting, starting with the district enrollment report. Rosburg said the enrollment information provided in the packet was generated by actual students attending school on campus on September 4, 2014. The enrollment report indicates student numbers are up three from this time last year and that these numbers are updated as we go, with the official count taking place on the third Friday of September.

Rosburg went on to report on the 2011-2016 Strategic Plan and its three action strategies, as well as the district's 2014-2015 goal to improve student achievement and growth. Rosburg stated the Strategic Plan information is reported out to the board at the monthly board meetings.

State Testing Results were included in the information; Rosburg recapped the WKCE, ACT, PLAN and EXPLORE test results as well as the Advanced Placement data. Rosburg explained that Wisconsin raised the benchmark scores in order for students to reach the proficient or advanced levels. Due to these benchmark score changes, WKCE results across the state show a significant decline. Curriculum Director Trish Sheridan can be contacted for further questions and information on the test results.

Rosburg summarized the report of the 2014-15 Capital Maintenance Projects including the 1996 rubber membrane portion of the high school roof was replaced during the summer of 2014. Additional insulation

and slope drains were part of this work. The roof has a 20 year warranty. Portions of the campus lots and roadways were chip sealed and striped. There were four corners from roadways into parking lots that had the turning radius into those areas increases to better accommodate bus traffic.

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Rosburg noted that the school district calendar includes six in-service days. This allows for teachers to do PLC work and standards alignment. Rosburg also noted the start and end times of each school day have been adjusted.

Wishard moved, with second by Connor, to authorize the Somerset Board of Education to acquire real estate during the 2014-2015 school year. Motion carried.

Brakke moved, with second by Baillargeon, to authorize the Somerset Board of Education to designate sites for district buildings and provide for the erection of suitable school buildings during the 2014-2015 school year. Motion carried.

Walters moved, with second by Eichten, to authorize the Somerset Board of Education to direct and provide for the prosecution and defense of legal procedures during the 2014-2015 school year. Motion carried.

Brakke moved, with second by Sheridan, to authorize reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses for travel of Somerset Board of Education members during the 2014-2015 school year. Motion carried.

Colbeth moved, with second by Connor, to approve a tentative tax levy of \$4,495,914.00 for the purpose of defraying the operation and maintenance of the public schools for the 2014-2015 school year. The projected mill rate shall be \$11.08 per \$1,000 value. Motion carried.

Wishard moved, with second by Sheridan, to authorize selling tangible personal property belonging to the school district that is no longer needed by the district as determined by the Administration during the 2014-2015 school year. Motion carried.

Baillargeon moved, with second by Lang, to approve that the Board salaries remain as follows for the 2014-2015 school year: \$2,000.00 for the Board President, \$1,800.00 for the Vice President, the Clerk and the Treasurer, and \$1,500.00 for all other members, and that all committee members will receive an additional \$25 per meeting for attending Special and Committee meetings. Motion carried.

Colbeth moved, with second by Walters, to authorize the Somerset Board of Education to hold the 2015 Annual Meeting on Monday, September 14, 2015, at 8:00 p.m. in the Learning Center Conference Room. Motion carried.

Colbeth moved, with second by Sheridan, to adjourn the 2014 Somerset School District Annual Meeting at 8:26 p.m. Motion carried.

<u>MINUTES</u>

Mike Connor called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m.

Roll Call was taken. Present were Tammie Wishard (for absent Brian Moulton), Mike Connor and Bob Gunther (for absent Kelly Ott). Also present were Tom Walters, Lorri Baillargeon, Becky Olson, Kathy Brakke, Jen Sutton, Carolyn Spoerl and Superintendent Randy Rosburg.

2014-2015 Employee Handbook: Two items from the 2014-2015 Employee Handbook were discussed: Opt Out. Noted is that the Opt Out benefit for spousal employees, which is grandfathering out is not part of this discussion.

Opt Out: The Alternate Benefit Plan (ABP) in Lieu of Health Insurance was walked through and discussion ensued. Also discussed was the Opt Out survey data from responding district employees who are eligible for district provided health and dental insurances. Survey results show it would cost an additional \$250,000 to eliminate the Opt Out as most all of those users of this benefit would take district provided insurances. The majority of those taking the survey recommended keeping the Opt Out benefit in the Employee Handbook. The committee recommends keeping the Opt Out language in the Employee Handbook.

Language from the 2014-2015 Employee Handbook was presented on the variable cost of the Opt Out for teachers, tied to the actual cost of the single health insurance annual premium. The change proposed to this language is to establish a fixed contribution amount rather than an amount based on the actual premium cost of single health insurance. The committee recommends discussing this item with the full board of education.

Opt out

The Opt Out benefit for spousal employees, which is grandfathering out, is not part of this discussion. The following language is from the teacher portion of the 2014-2015 Employee Handbook. The change proposed in this language is to establish a fixed contribution amount rather than an amount based on the actual premium cost of single health insurance, see item F below.

8.04 Alternate Benefit Plan [ABP] in Lieu of Health Insurance

- A. Employees who choose the ABP option will be required to sign up by September I and commit to this change to be effective the following September.
- B. In order for this provision to remain in effect, a sufficient number of employees must opt out of their coverage so as not to cause an added expense for the District. Such determination of the additional expense is made by the District in its sole discretion.
- C. The Board may, at its discretion, discontinue the cash compensation in lieu of health insurance benefit by providing the participating employees with written notice of not less than sixty (60) days and an "open enrollment" opportunity to enroll in the group health insurance plan.
- D. Any employee who qualifies for participation in the District group health insurance plan may waive such participation and elect to receive cash compensation in lieu of the health insurance benefit. If the District employs both spouses prior to July 1, 2012, and one spouse is participating in this benefit while one spouse participates in the health insurance benefit, they will be eligible for participation in both the ABP and the health insurance benefit until they resign or retire from the district or decide to no longer use this

"Learning Today to Succeed Tomorrow"

benefit, whichever occurs first. This provision, item 8.04, D. will not be available to additional spouses effective July 1, 2012.

- E. Employees eligible for insurance may annually choose, consistent with the terms of the cafeteria plan in Section 15.01 and 15.02 between:
- 1. Participation in the District's health plan, with the premium payment specified in the applicable part of the *Handbook* covering such employees, or
- 2. A cash payment equal to the amount listed in the applicable part of the *Handbook* covering such employees.
- F. Cash Compensation: The cash contribution dollar amount for 2014-2015 shall be equal to the actual cost of the annual premium for district provided single health insurance. The cash contribution dollar amount, starting on July 1, 2015, shall be equal to \$5,300.00. The cash payment under this option will be made in equal installments over the course of the total number of pay periods for the school year, and will be prorated in conjunction with the HSA contribution, should the employee switch from District insurance to the Opt Out Plan during the year, with the intent being that the total combined district contribution not exceed the Opt Out Plan amount.
- G. The cash compensation amount shall be paid to the employee as additional taxable earnings which are not subject to Wisconsin Retirement System (WRS) contributions to the extent permitted by WRS rule or law, with the appropriate employee F.I.C.A., state and federal taxes deducted from the teacher's payroll check.
- H. Where the employee chooses cash, the District shall facilitate the deferral of cash to a tax-sheltered annuity (TSA) plan.
- 1. An employee electing taxable cash in lieu of health insurance is deemed to request the District to pay the cash to a TSA vendor unless the employee requests in writing to have the cash paid to the employee. The employee shall be permitted to change the TSA amount or vendor up to twelve (12) times per calendar year provided he/she provides the District with at least one (1) month notice.
- 2. The District shall pay the cash to the TSA vendor on the normal payroll dates. Amounts received as additional compensation, and deferred to a TSA vendor, shall be subject to all applicable payroll taxes, including FICA and Medicare.
 - Any employee whose TSA salary reduction amount exceeds the limitations of law is ineligible for additional deferrals to the TSA. The amount, which would have been contributed to the TSA except for the limitations of law, will be

added to the employee's paycheck as taxable compensation subject to all applicable payroll taxes, including FICA and Medicare.

- I. Beginning Eligibility Date for Alternative Benefit Plan Payments:
- 1. New Employees. Payments shall be based on the employee's eligibility date. For new employees, this constitutes the employee's first day of active service. Employees not electing health coverage must enroll in the cafeteria plan prior to the employee's first day of active service. Thereafter, an annual election must be made prior to the beginning of each cafeteria plan benefit year, which is September 1. However, if the employee's first date of active service is after the 15th of the month, no ABP contributions are required in that month. If the employee's first date of active service is on the 1st through the 15th of the month, the District will contribute the payment.
- 2. <u>Current Employees</u>. Current employees changing to the ABP when permitted by applicable Internal Revenue Code section 125 "cafeteria plan" rules are only eligible to waive coverage for the health insurance and begin the ABP on the first payroll of any month. Absent a mid-year (January through December) cafeteria section 125 exception [such as an employee getting married, loss of spouse coverage, etc.], employees must make a written annual cafeteria plan election by September 1 to permit the election of the cash option in the next cafeteria plan year. Once the employee is eligible to begin ABP status, contributions will begin in that month.
- J. Proration of ABP: If an employee has a qualifying event in their life and changes from ABP to district provided health insurance the ABP dollar contribution to the employee shall be prorated on a normal payroll basis. The cash payment under this option will be made in equal installments over the course of the total number of pay periods for the school year, and will be prorated in conjunction with the HSA contribution, should the employee switch from District insurance to the Opt Out Plan during the year, with the intent being that the total combined district contribution not exceed the Opt Out Plan amount.

Opt Out survey data is attached from responding district employees who are eligible for district provided health and dental insurances. When premium costs are applied to the data, the annual operational costs increase for the district by approximately \$250,000. The data shows it is cost effective to continue the Opt Out benefit for employees. I recommend keeping the current Opt Out benefit language in the Employee Handbook and adding in a fixed contribution amount equal to \$5,300 starting on July 1, 2015. (Action)



When our teachers and support staff were Unionized, Act 10 required we bargain an annual base wage and the distribution of that base wage. As our teachers and support staff elected to not recertify as a Union, they are non-unionized as of July 1, 2014. A group of teachers shared with me that they are functioning as an Association. We have no obligation to bargain with the Association.

As a result of this, we held meet and confer sessions to include all district employees when discussing wage and benefit information for the 2014-2015 school year. The meet and confer practice has worked well for years with our supervisory support staff and administrative employees. It worked well last spring too for our teachers and support staff. All voices had the opportunity to be heard. I received many positive comments from teachers and support staff regarding the use of the meet and confer process.

I recommend updating the 7.01 Total Base Wage and 7.02 Distribution of Total Base Wage language by replacing the reference to bargain with meet and confer language, as shown bellow:

7.01 Total Base Wage

The total teacher base wage increase amount for the upcoming school year shall may be bargained discussed in meet and confer sassions between the Association teachers and the District and shall be established by the District.

7.02 Distribution of Base Wage

The Association teachers and District shall may bargain discuss in meet and confer sessions how the total teacher base wage amount shall may be distributed and the District shall make the distribution determination.


Q1 Are you eligible for district provided health and dental insurance?




